

## **RHYTHMS OF REVIVAL WEEK 2**

Revival is not a one-and-done experience. Last week, we learned that revival is an environment and attitude of the heart, deeply desiring to encounter the presence of God. As we wake up to the areas of our heart that must be purged and prepared to make room for the saturating presence of the Holy Spirit, we begin to find our rhythm in sync with Him; we become more consistent in clinging to the truth of God's Word, abundant in prayer, overflowing in Christ-like love for others, humble in repentance and eager to imitate Christ. Just like it takes two dots to make a line, a rhythm is repeated. This week, we're continuing the same pattern as last week with an emphasis on spending each day in intentional worship, repentance, prayer and active preparation for the Holy Spirit's movement and presence.

**WORSHIP: PSALM 147, ECCLESIASTES 3:9-15,  
PSALM 148, PSALM 149, PSALM 150, 1 JOHN 4,  
EPHESIANS 1:3-14**

Let's begin each day with an attitude eager to praise God, zealous to see God glorified in everything, big or small, busy or slow, rain or shine. How have you experienced God's love lately? What have you noticed about God's character? How does it make you feel? Tell Him! Thank Him for Jesus and the Holy Spirit, that He has not withheld them from us.

**REPENT: ISAIAH 52-53, 1 JOHN 1:5-10, 1 JOHN 2,  
PROVERBS 5, JAMES 5:16**

As the Holy Spirit continues to reveal the sinful, broken areas of our hearts not yet yielded to Jesus, take time each day to consciously repent of these things. Cast them at the foot of the cross where Jesus was crucified to take these things away forever. Leave them there. Remember the price Jesus paid (in full!) to free you. Remember the secret sins of the heart. Confess them to one another and pray for each other so that we may be healed and not slip further into sin. Let's submit our hearts at the feet of Jesus, bare and without pretense.

**PRAY: THESSALONIANS 3:1-5, 1 CHRONICLES 16:8-36, EPHESIANS 1:15-23, JAMES 5:13-20**

This week, let's continue to communicate with the Most High God of Heaven. Thank Him for the hope and rescue we have in Jesus. Thank Him for knowing us and listening. Continue to ask the Lord to move powerfully in new, undeniable ways in your life, household, community, nation and around the globe. Continue to pray for our persecuted brothers and sisters in Christ, that their pain and troubles might produce lasting spiritual fruit and fragrant worship with their sacrifices. Pray for your own opportunities to live and die for Christ. Where there is conflict with those around us, please pray for those you regard as enemies, that the Lord will abundantly show the warmth of His compassion and the blessing of His love, that the Lord might be glorified in every aspect.

**PREPARE: ISAIAH 52:7-12, PSALM 146:5-10, 1 JOHN 3, 2 JOHN**

Don't withhold the Good News from a hungry world! Take time to speak to our Heavenly Father and tell Him you want Him to use you for His glory. Tell Him you submit your wants, plans and life to whatever He wants. Ask the Holy Spirit to prompt you and reveal situations or people you can speak the truth, love and healing only found in Jesus. Make sure you're sincere and willing to follow through when the Lord prompts you. If you find yourself getting caught up in your head and not hearing the Lord's voice, repeat the daily routine we've been practicing.
